
# 92 Energy's Background

- 92 Energy (92E) is an active, uranium focused exploration company
- 92 Energy is a new entrant to the Saskatchewan mineral exploration scene, i.e., an early-stage explorer
- Head office is in Perth, Australia, with a technical group based in western Canada
- Close knit technical team with decades of work experience in north Saskatchewan (former Denison/IsoEnergy, Fission Uranium)
- 92E's first ever work program was conducted during the summer of 2021, since then five more boots on the ground programs have been completed




### 92 Energy in the Athabasca Basin

- 92E owns 100% of six uranium exploration projects in and around the Athabasca Basin
- Three projects (Wares, Powerline and Cypress) are located in the Uranium City – Fond du Lac area
- Three projects (Gemini, Tower and Clover) are located in the eastern Athabasca Basin, near Wollaston Lake and Points North
- To date 92E has only performed work at Gemini and Tower



### **GMZ Uranium Discovery at the Gemini Property**


- During 92E's first ever drill program at the Gemini project in 2021, the Company intersected 5.5m of 0.12% U<sub>3</sub>O<sub>8</sub> in the final drillhole
- This uranium discovery was subsequently named the Gemini Mineralised Zone (GMZ)
- Since the discovery of the GMZ, two drill programs have been carried out by 92E totaling 45 drillholes and 12,542 metres of drilling
- Gemini work programs are based out of a temporary work camp 100 km southwest of Wollaston that houses up to 25 personnel






Radioactive drill core from the GMZ – handheld scintillometer values >13,000 counts per second (cps) compared to a background of 80 cps

- Highlights from 2022 drill campaigns at the GMZ include:
  - ► GEM22-025: 40m @ 0.62% U<sub>3</sub>O<sub>8</sub> including 18.0m of 1.16% U<sub>3</sub>O<sub>8</sub>
  - ► GEM22-027: 68.2m of total composite radioactivity including 34.4m @ 0.2% eU<sub>3</sub>O<sub>8</sub>
  - ► GEM22-042: 25.4m @ 0.3% eU<sub>3</sub>O<sub>8</sub> including 3.6m @ 0.9% eU<sub>3</sub>O<sub>8</sub>
- The GMZ has now been defined over a 200 by 220 meter area, between 60 to 200 meters vertically from surface and remains open in all directions




# **Tower Project Drilling 2022**

- Starting in September 2022, 92E undertook a maiden drill program at the Tower property
- Work was based out of Points North
- Positive initial drill results with anomalous radioactivity up to 960 cps
- Significant faulting and hydrothermal alteration in drill core
- Results warrant follow up drilling and additional work programs



### **Future 92 Work Programs**

- Gemini Ground and drone geophysical surveys underway, preparing for a winter 2023 drill program
- Clover Planning underway for geophysical coverage in early 2023
- Wares Planned ground geophysical program and drilling in 2023
- Tower Planning underway for follow up drilling based on fall 2022 drill results
- Powerline Planned airborne geophysical surveys, boots on the ground follow up



# 92 Energy Commitment to Northern Community Engagement

- People from northern communities (La Ronge and north) have made up on average 20% of the total field staff during drill programs at Gemini
- 92E intends to sustain at least 20% local employment for work programs, whenever possible
- Engagement with Hatchet Lake and English River First Nation currently ongoing



### 92 Energy Commitment to the Environment

- 92 Energy is committed to environmentally responsible exploration in Saskatchewan
- Drill programs follow BMPs and utilize solid recovery units (SRU) to isolate radioactive materials and drill cuttings
- Undertaking work to record, clean and reclaim historical work sites left by previous operators on 92E ground

## 92 Energy Saskatchewan Vendor Engagement



- 92E strives to engage Saskatchewan based vendors whenever possible
- Approximately 83% of the total expenditures from 2021 and 2022 exploration programs have been in Saskatchewan based companies

- On the job training opportunities in the following fields exist with 92E:
  - ▶ Geological drill core sampling, geotechnical logging, drill core logging, downhole surveying
  - ► Kitchen operations
  - ► Camp operations
  - ▶ Diamond drilling (with support from Bryson Drilling) 5<sup>th</sup> man, drill helpers, pad builders
- 92 Energy is <u>actively seeking interested</u> <u>personnel in all the above</u>
- Needs identified by 92E:
  - ▶ Personnel transport (specifically to and from Wollaston or northern communities)
  - ▶ Winter road maintenance
