DETAILS OF THE JOB: As a Welder in the minerals industry, you might work on many types of equipment from light vehicles to large crushers. There is some fabrication involved, a lot of structural repairing, specialized welding on different materials, and pipefitting. You will be required to identify and document the welding related problems, communicate and solve the problems.

A TYPICAL DAY: On a day-to-day basis Dustin works with mill maintenance, trouble shooting, repairing and fabricating out of steel/ metal what is needed for repairs. Everyday finds Dustin tackling new and different jobs.
